

### Case of the issue::






The fixed distal shoe space maintainer, as first reported by Willett (1932), is an appliance employed when there is premature loss of second primary molar prior to the eruption of first permanent molar. The appliance usually is cantilevered from the first primary molar with an extension into the alveolar process to guide the eruption of the first permanent molar into its normal position. In this manner the appliance prevents the severe loss of space and malocclusion that results from the mesial drifting of the first permanent molar during and after eruption.
