

GUIDELINES FOR PROTOTYPE COMPETITION

- Open to students, faculty members, early-stage entrepreneurs, and research scholars.
- Individuals, teams, or registered start-ups can participate.
- Maximum **4 members per team**. Interdisciplinary teams are encouraged.
- Only **one prototype per team** is permitted.
- Prototype must be **original and developed by the participants**.
- Acceptable formats:
 - Functional physical model
 - Working digital application
 - MVP (Minimum Viable Product)
 - Hardware/Software innovation
- Simulation models are allowed (if properly demonstrated).
- Previously awarded prototypes are not allowed.
- Teams must bring their own laptops, tools, adapters, and materials.
- Basic display table and power supply will be provided.
- Last Date to register is 10th March 2026. Abstract (250–300 words) submission mandatory before deadline i.e 10th March 2026
- Submission includes: Title of Prototype, Problem Statement, Proposed Solution, Innovation & USP along with Market/Application Scope and Team Details
- Setup Time: 45 minutes before judging followed by Prototype Demonstration: 8–10 minutes and Q&A session with Jury: 5 minutes
- Participants retain full ownership of their innovation.
- Organizing committee may use photographs/videos for academic and promotional purposes with due credit.
- Teams are encouraged to pursue patent protection where applicable.
- Strict adherence to ethical standards. Copyright infringement models will lead to disqualification.
- Any damage to venue property will result in penalties. Safety norms must be followed during demonstration.
