What Happens During a Pediatric Root Canal?

The idea of a root canal can be intimidating, but knowing what to expect can help. Here's a simple breakdown of the procedure:

1. The dentist removes the infected or damaged part inside the tooth.
2. The inside of the tooth is cleaned and sealed to prevent further infection.
3. A filling or a small cap (crown) is placed on top to strengthen and protect the tooth.

Pediatric dentists are trained to make this process as smooth and painless as possible for children.

A pediatric root canal (also called a pulpotomy) has several benefits:

- It saves the natural tooth, keeping other teeth in place and supporting healthy jaw growth.
